ROUTE DESCRIPTION

TL = TURN LEFT; TR = TURN RIGHT; SO = STRAIGHT ON; PF = PUBLIC FOOTPATH; PC = PEDESTRIAN CROSSING.

Turn **RIGHT** from car park, pass the pub and follow the road around the corner to the left to reach the A63 main road and cross it **WITH CARE**. Go to the green public footpath sign (A19 and Barlby Road) and **TL** down this path. Follow between hedges, then diagonally right across the field to cross a small wooden bridge. Follow path straight ahead over 2nd wooden bridge and climb up to main road. As you wait to cross this road look right to a large green road sign. On the sign is a brown directional sign

Q1 - Where are you being directed to (on the brown sign)?

Cross the very fast and busy main road with **EXTREME CARE**. Then straight over down the steps, through a small woodland. Follow the path left down the field side through a wooden gate to the road. Cross the road, almost immediately opposite turn down the road signposted Peartree Close. This road turns but continue **SO**, now Riverside, to the beginning of the hedge. **TR** just before the hedge then **TL** down the side of the field and then up the bank to the top of the walled riverside path. **TL** and follow the riverbank path, ignoring any tracks down, all the way to Selby. Eventually you arrive at the Old Selby Toll Bridge. *If you wish to visit the town and its Abbey you can turn right here.*

Q2 - Before you cross the road look at the Building on your right – What year is given on the black plaque on the wall (to the right of the entrance)?

Cross the main road **WITH CARE** and continue **SO** with the River Ouse still on your right. You will go under the road leading to the Selby Swing Bridge, pass industrial units and derelict farm buildings. At a bend near a large tree **TR** through gate with a yellow footpath sign, stay along the riverbank following a small wall. Go under the road bridge(Selby Bye Pass) and over the stile by double wooden gates. Carry on along the track by the riverbank. A dyke comes in from the left after more derelict buildings.

Q3 - What is the date on the oblong building at the end of the dyke?

Carry on along the track and as you approach Turnham Hall leave the riverside, climbing the stile. **TL** onto track that goes to the left side of Turnham Barn (with a new wooden garage on your right). **SO** with fence on your right. At the drain, cross then **TL**. **SO** with the drain on your left. At the next junction by the pylon, where the drain turns left, you need to cross the field to your right in a 10'clock direction (roughly), aiming towards the row of trees that are to the right of a large hedge. At the trees **TR** and look for a 2-plank bridge with a handrail that is hidden in the trees. Cross the bridge and **SO** through the next field towards a fence that can be seen in the distance. At the fence **TR** to the railway crossing.

Cross the stile, railway line **WITH EXTREME CARE**, and a second stile. **SO** under the power lines towards the road and buildings. At the road, cross **WITH CARE**, then **TR** and take the first left into Lund Village.

Q4 – There is a red post box on the left as you turn towards the village – what is the post box number?

Follow this lane through the small hamlet, it bends left and right and continues through arable land. At Gale House on right **TL** down Old Railway Walk. Leave the Railway Walk by turning right at the metal gate with several signs. Its signed Osgodby.

The wide track leads across fields and becomes tarmac. At Junction of Sand Lane and Back Lane bear left to stay on Sand Lane.

Q5 - On the right you will see Crescent Farm house – what is the date above the door?

At the junction with Cliffe Road TL to The Wadkin Arms.
